RECYCLING ACHIEVEMENTS



The bar graph above showcases the recycling achievements of the St. Brigid's Community Action Project:

- 2,682 cans, bottles and poppers were saved from landfill.
- 1,000 glue sticks were collected for recycling.
- 906 textas/markers were also collected for recycling.

REDUCTION IN LANDFILL CONTRIBUTION

REDUCTION IN SORTING TIME



The graphs above illustrate two key outcomes from the St. Brigid's Community Action Project:

- Reduction in Landfill Contribution: The number of bins contributed to the landfill was nearly halved, dropping from 69 bins before the initiatives to 37 bins afterward, over a span of three weeks.
- Reduction in Sorting Time: The time spent on sorting waste was significantly reduced from 50 minutes to an average of 15 minutes weekly.
